

- Don't fall into analysis paralysis!






Emergency Thoughts

The EOP is a guide make the ICS structure **FIT** the situation.



ACT as the conductor of the orchestra.


ENSURE that all parts are being played

ADAPT the plan when appropriate


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






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







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











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
Incident Command System

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Helps avoid duplication of effort.









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








Emergency Operations Plan



The Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) is the District's plan for how to respond to and recover from major emergencies and disasters.

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
Emergency Operations Plan

 - Public and Non-Public


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
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





































Emergency Operations Center

College EOC:


